From the Pastor

Dear ones,

Advent is almost here. The First Sunday of Advent is just 5 short days away as I write this. I feel rushed already.

How can Christmas be so close, so soon?

It causes me to think about what I value most about these holy seasons that are fast approaching. I love the anticipation of Advent. And then I also dislike the steady reminder that the time left for crafting the perfect Christmas Eve sermon is rapidly declining! I like the ramping up of energy for celebration and the growing hope of seeing people that I only get to see a few times each year. And then, I bemoan the fact that I have no clue what to get some of them for Christmas gifts.

There are other things that I love about Christmas, but the thing I love most is the deep reminder of how much God loves us, all of us, the best and the worst of us. On Christmas Eve we will gather in the sweet gift of being able to praise God for the gift of God's self to us. The mystery of the incarnation is so very staggering. God the Father sent God the Son to take on our flesh and become one of us, to walk among us, to teach us, to draw us to himself, and to take away the sin of the world. The Second Person of the Holy Trinity comes to us to offer himself as a sacrifice for our sin, to be the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world. My sin. Your sin.

I wonder, how could I let anything about the business of the Advent and Christmas season distract me from the sheer wonder of God becoming like me, for me. And yet, just today, I have already felt frustrated that I have let this blessed season sneak up on me, yet again. How can we all avoid that? In November of 2021, I took up that question in the newsletter article for December. I wrote the following:

I have a suggestion. When you find yourself on the edge of giving in to the hurry, remember the "why" of the season. We celebrate Christmas to remind us that God came to us, as one of us. My favorite reflection on the incarnation (a word used to describe the eternal Son of God, the Word, becoming flesh and dwelling among us) is a treatise by Saint Athanasius who died in 373 AD. It is entitled "On the Incarnation." I want to share a quote from it that stuck with me and gave me a new appreciation for Christmas. Athanasius writes:

...it was our sorry case that caused the Word to come down, our transgression that called out His love for us, so that He made haste to help us and to appear among us. It is we who were the cause of His taking human form, and for our salvation that in his great love He was both born and manifested in a human body.¹

When you feel the onset of hurry as you prepare for Christmas, guard your heart by remembering the why of the season, the one thing necessary to be at peace... God loved us enough to become one of us and die the death that sin requires, in our place, so that we can live in peace. "Glory to God in the highest heaven, and on earth peace among those whom he favors!" (Luke 2:14)

Remember Christ!
