

From the Pastor

Dear ones,

It occurred to me this week that most people in The United Methodist Church probably do not know the questions that their pastors who are ordained as Elders are asked before they are presented to the Clery Session of the Annual Conference for approval to be ordained. So, I am sharing with you the questions that Bishop L. Jonathan Holston asked of me as a condition of ordination. The questions are in bold and are followed by my answers as of this writing! There are additional questions that are asked during the ordination service itself (I have those posted to my office door if you are interested in reading them).

¶ 336. *Historic Examination for Admission into Full Connection*—The bishop as chief pastor shall engage those seeking to be admitted in serious self-searching and prayer to prepare them for their examination before the conference. At the time of the examination the bishop shall also explain to the conference the historic nature of the following questions and seek to interpret their spirit and intent. The questions are these and any others that may be thought necessary:

Have you faith in Christ?

I do. I am deeply in love with Jesus and trust him to save me from Sin and Death. He is my hope.

Are you going on to perfection?

With God's help, by grace, through faith, I find myself loving God and my neighbor.

Do you expect to be made perfect in love in this life?

Yes, but not by my own efforts. I expect that one day I will love God and others out of pure habit.

Are you earnestly striving after it?

I am, as I trust that the Holy Spirit is conforming me to the image of Christ, making me more like him, so that this is possible.

Are you resolved to devote yourself wholly to God and his work?

Yes. In some ways, I see everything I am and do that is good as being fitted for this purpose.

Do you know the General Rules of our Church?

I do! I read them a long time ago and thought they were a bit quirky. But the gist is "Do no harm. Do good. Attend to the ordinances of God." The ordinances of God are those things we believe were commanded by God including:

Public worship

The ministry of the Word, either read or expounded

The Supper of the Lord (Holy Communion)

Family and private prayer

Searching the Scriptures

Fasting or abstinence

Some people have started calling the third rule "Stay in Love with God" but I reject that as these are all bodily practices engaging the will, the spirit, and the heart and are meant to be ways that God gives grace to us. But, they do help us stay in love with God.

Will you keep them?

With God's help I will (even the part about not speaking ill of magistrates and ministers).

Do you approve our Church government and polity?

Yes, enough so that I agreed to teach it to lay people for 6 years or so in the Lay Servants program of the Rock Hill District.

Will you support and maintain them?

I will and do.

Will you diligently instruct the children in every place?

I love telling children about God and how much they are loved by God and by the Church.

Will you visit from house to house?

Absolutely. Give me call and invite me over! This has been a hard skill to remember since, due to COVID-19, I spent three years being unable to visit folks in their homes and have probably gotten too used to not being able to do so. So, please do consider calling me for a visit. I would love to learn your story.

Will you recommend fasting or abstinence, both by precept and example?

I have, but this is the most difficult of these. Once, I was part of a group fast. The men of the Swansea Charge United

Methodist Men agreed to fast on Fridays at lunch time. The money we would have spent we saved and brought to

our meetings. We used that money to pay for one of the men's prescriptions. I was deeply impacted by that show of

devotion and love.

Are you determined to employ all your time in the work of God?

I was wondering if I would still be able to fish when the Bishop asked this... but I said yes.

Are you in debt so as to embarrass you in your work?

I am not. I worked hard in Seminary to leave with as little debt as possible. I was fairly successful and we were able to finish paying for my education at Lutheran Theological Southern Seminary fairly quickly.

Will you observe the following directions?

a) Be diligent. Never be unemployed. Never be triflingly employed. Never trifle away time; neither spend any more time at any one place than is strictly necessary.

- I think about this question once in a while as I am watching YouTube videos. I tell myself it's productive because I am learning about things that keep me happy.
- b) Be punctual. Do everything exactly at the time. And do not mend our rules, but keep them; not for wrath, but for conscience' sake.

Yes.

I hope that these questions, and my answers, will give you some insight as to why I do the things that I do, in the ways that I do them. May the Holy Spirit work within us together, that having been born through water and the Spirit, we may both live and love as faithful disciples of Jesus Christ!


