### From the Pastor

Dear ones,

As I was beginning to think of something to write for this month, I thought about the questions that people usually ask me when they are trying to treat the Holy Bible as a science textbook, or prove I'm an idiot for believing. I thought, "I could explore the question, 'Why are there no chickens in the Old Testament." This thought occurred because the usual question I get from scoffers is "Why are there no dinosaurs in the Bible?" Strangely enough, I know of a private school in one of the communities to which I was appointed that refused to let the children see the dinosaur exhibit at the South Carolina State Museum because as they said, "dinosaurs are not in the Bible." The religious leaders of that school believed the fossil records to be planted by the Devil specifically for the purpose of tricking us into doubting the scriptures.

Completely forgetting about Peter's rooster, I entered the word "chicken" into the search bar of "BibleWorks," which is a Bible exploration program that I use quite often. It returned zero results. No mention of the word chicken in the NIV, NIV, or KJV. But the word "rooster" does appear in Proverbs 30:31 as part of a list of things that strut about proudly... but some English translations use the word "greyhound" there so I suspect that it is not clear how to translate that Hebrew word into English. So, it would seem that the chicken, a creature central to human flourishing since it was domesticated around 7,000—10,000 years ago

somewhere in Southeast Asia, is conspicuously absent even though Proverbs 30:31 may indicate knowledge of the bird in Hebrew culture. I found this odd. So, I did a google search and found an article on the website of the Smithsonian Magazine entitled "How the Chicken Conquered the World." That article contained this fascinating quote:

But one major religious tradition—ironically, the one that gave rise to matzo-ball soup and the Sunday chicken dinner—failed to imbue chickens with much religious significance. The Old Testament passages concerning ritual sacrifice reveal a distinct preference on the part of Yahweh for red meat over poultry. In Leviticus 5:7, a guilt offering of two turtledoves or pigeons is acceptable if the sinner in question is unable to afford a lamb, but in no instance does the Lord request a chicken. Matthew 23:37 contains a passage in which Jesus likens his care for the people of Jerusalem to a hen caring for her brood. This image, had it caught on, could have completely changed the course of Christian iconography, which has been dominated instead by depictions of the Good Shepherd. The rooster plays a small but crucial role in the Gospels in helping to fulfill the prophecy that Peter would deny Jesus "before the cock crows." (In the ninth century, Pope Nicholas I decreed that a figure of a rooster should be placed atop every church as a reminder of the incident—which is why many churches still have cockerel-shaped weather vanes.)<sup>1</sup>

Who knew? Honestly, it never have occurred to me that the origin of a chicken often being placed at the top of weathervanes had nothing to do with farming or rural America, but was in fact a reminder not to disown, betray, or forget Jesus Christ.

May the Holy Spirit work within us all that, having been born through water and the Spirit, we may live as faithful disciples of Jesus Christ and may our every encounter with a chicken remind us that our Lord deserves our loyalty.


